The sky visualizes embrace and protection, where the mountains and earth represents solidity and stability - which is also a symbol of an optimistic direction of growth that is directed upwards. The representation of an upward direction means bringing the whole of ASEAN to grow in a good direction. Furthermore, the ocean represents the unifier of each island between countries in the region. The Maleo bird can also be seen at the logo, as it represents the symbolization of typical bird endemic to Sulawesi, Indonesia.

## 2013 Chairmanship, Brunei Darussalam

Theme: **'Our People, Our Future Together'**. The entire logo is a swirling swirl, one of the floral patterns found in the traditional woven textiles (Kain tenunan) of Brunei Darussalam, symbolising a dynamic ASEAN that continues to move forward in meeting political, economic, social and security needs. The logo is composed of 10 human forms holding hands symbolising the 10 Member States that are united in bringing development to ASEAN's economics, political, social and security. The colours red, black, yellow, white, and blue on the human form allude to the colours of the flags of the ASEAN countries. Blue stands for peace and political stability; Red symbolises bravery and dynamism and safeguards security; White signifies purity, and Yellow symbolizes financial prosperity. The ASEAN logo located in the middle symbolizes a stable, peaceful, united and dynamic ASEAN. The theme emphasises the role of people of ASEAN Member States in advancing cooperation in the fields of political-security, economic, and socio-cultural. The future of the region depends on the collective efforts of its people to ensure the progress of regional development.

The outermost colors of this logo represent the colors of the national flags of each ASEAN member country, this proves the diversity of ASEAN.





The logo’s theme colour is inspired by the colour of purple mangosteen, Thailand’s “Queen of Fruits”.



## 2020 Chairmanship, Viet Nam



The ASEAN 2020 Chairmanship takes the theme "**Cohesive and Responsive**". The logo is in the form of a lotus – a flower that has been considered by the Vietnamese people as the national flower. The lotus in the ASEAN 2020 logo has 3 multi-colored wings which symbolize the 3 pillars of the ASEAN Community and are arranged in one direction, symbolizing the interconnectedness of ASEAN. In the center of this logo is the ASEAN emblem and the image of the Lac bird – a bird which is an important symbol in Vietnam's history that is stretched high. It's like a boat moving forward, bringing the ASEAN Community to sustainable growth, connectivity and integration for shared prosperity. The colors of the ASEAN Year 2020 logo are very harmonious. Among other things, yellow represents prosperity, optimism and joy, red represents dynamism, energy and determination, blue represents peace, wisdom and trust.

## 2022 Chairmanship, Cambodia

Theme: “ASEAN A.C.T.: Addressing Challenges Together.” For the concept art of the new logo for ASEAN 2022, the inclusion of a lotus flower symbol is intended to represent a form of Khmer art that is derived from relief carvings on the walls of ancient Cambodian temples. The lotus shape is encased in a golden circle and has the ASEAN emblem in its center to symbolize prosperity and harmony in peace. The logo maintains the four signature colors of the ASEAN flag (blue, red, yellow and white). Six petals of the lotus flower are blue, to represent peace, stability, trust, confidence, solidarity and cooperation which are the core aspiration of ASEAN. Four petals are red, to represent the life, health, courage and dynamism of ASEAN. The golden color of the circle signifies grandeur, success, achievement and victory around the ASEAN Community building process, and sense of togetherness and unity of ASEAN. Together, the mix of these colors is meant to epitomize the ethnic diversity of the 10 ASEAN Member States.
